The Washington Architectural Foundation's Architecture in the Schools (AIS) program is a unique curriculum enrichment program that matches the skills of design professionals with the talents of teachers in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.

AIS works in a wide range of subject areas and has been successful in classrooms ranging from kindergarten to twelfth grade. Design professionals visit their classrooms once a week for eight weeks over a semester. Often the highlight of the students' week, these visits demonstrate how the built environment affects every aspect of life in Washington, D.C., Virginia, or Maryland.

Throughout the semester, both the teachers and design professionals attend progress meetings and training sessions to increase their skills. By the end of the program, students have a completed project to show for their efforts, and classroom teachers have gained enough experience to recreate the program. The projects are displayed in a semester-end exhibit at the Martin Luther King Library.
